Upcoming Roebling Chapter Events

For the Industrial Heritage Walks organized by Joe Macasek and sponsored by the Morris County Park Commission, please refer to the <u>attached brochure</u>. We'll send out a reminder a week or so in advance of each tour.

Saturday April 21st - Split Rock Iron Furnace

Led by Joe Macasek and Bierce Riley. This walk is a rare opportunity to visit Morris County's only standing iron furnace and to explore the village that supported its operation. This is an Industrial Heritage Walk.

Monday April 23rd - Thomas Edison National Historic Park, West Orange, NJ

We will be spending all day at the Edison National Historic Park, touring the laboratory complex in the morning and the Glenmont Estate in the afternoon. We will have National Park Service staff who specialize in technology tours take us through the laboratories and machine shop, and we'll have guided tours of the mansion, grounds, and outbuildings. This special tour is on a weekday when the park is normally closed to visitors. Details will be sent ASAP.

Saturday April 28th - New Jersey Canals & Local History Symposium

Sponsored by the Canal Society of New Jersey and the Morris County Heritage Commission and open to Roebling Chapter members. Full details are in the "attached brochure" above.

Saturday May 5th - Roebling NJ

Led by Ron Parker. We will tour the company-built industrial town of Roebling, including a docent-led tour of the Roebling Museum in the morning and a museum docent-led walk around the town in the afternoon. Details will be sent ASAP.

Saturday May 12th - Fort Hancock, Sandy Hook NJ

Led by Joe Macasek and Bierce Riley. Strategically located at the entrance to New York Harbor, Sandy Hook is the site of the nation's first lighthouse, built in 1764, and of Fort Hancock, the best-preserved military post in the northeast. This is an Industrial Heritage Walk.

May 31 to June 3rd - SIA National 47th Annual Conference, Richmond VA

The Society for Industrial Archeology, our parent organization, will hold the 47th Annual Conference in Richmond VA. Registration is now open, and full details are at the SIA website.

Saturday June 16th - Morris Canal Greenway Walk, Denville to Rockaway

Led by Joe Macasek and Bierce Riley. On this tour we will walk a seldom-visited stretch of the Morris Canal along the Rockaway River, including the sites of the Beaver Brook Feeder and the crossing of the Hibernia Mine Railroad. This is an Industrial Heritage Walk.

Saturday June 30th - Schooner A.J. Meerwald, from Liberty State Park

Saturday July 7th - Decker-Kincaid Homestead, Mines and Forge Site

Led by Joe Macasek and Bierce Riley. We will visit the homestead, look for remains of the Decker bloomery forge, and explore the nearby Rock Pond Mountain to find the workings of the Rockaway Valley Mines. This is an Industrial Heritage Walk.
